Betula populifolia

- Leaves are poplar-shaped and tremble at the slightest breeze. Unlike other birch trees, the bark of the Gray birch does not peel easily. Bark is dark reddish brown when the tree is young before maturing to chalky white.
- Small animals & birds love the seeds & catkins of Gray birch which form in fall, maturing the following spring.
- Grows well in sandy or gravelly soil, often found in clumps.
- Also known as Wire Birch
- Native to Eastern Ontario
